#1 On The Treasure Coast For College & Career Readiness

St. Lucie Public Schools is ranked #1 on the Treasure Coast for college & career readiness. The percentage of students who earned an industry certification surpassed Martin, Indian River, and Okeechobee counties, ranking the School District #1 on the Treasure Coast and 12th in the state of Florida.

St. Lucie Public Schools students are graduating with college credit and workforce ready credentials. Our students benefit by being qualified for high-skilled jobs with lucrative incomes. They are earning college credits before starting college, resulting in time and cost savings. The nationally recognized industry certifications earned by SLPS students are the same certifications that industry professionals are obtaining. In addition, not only are our students better prepared for rigorous college coursework, they have a unique advantage over their counterparts across the state of Florida and the country for college admission.

Attendance Rate Improvements

Knowing that the student attendance rate across the country and the state have declined since COVID-19, the Superintendent intentionally, thoughtfully, and empathetically mobilized District and school resources to focus on increasing the attendance rate across the District. As a result, the year-over-year attendance rate increased substantially, resulting in over five hundred more students attending on a daily basis, translating into an increase of 3,000 instructional hours per day.

St. Lucie Public Schools has maintained a remarkable 90%+ graduation rate for the last seven years. This prestigious achievement is held only by three school districts across the state of Florida, one of which is St. Lucie Public Schools. This is due to the diligence and dedication by our students, along with staff who are committed to ensuring all students meet the rigorous graduation requirements in four years.

Best Places to Work

With over 5,000 employees, St. Lucie Public Schools was recognized as one of St. Lucie County's Best Places to Work. This is the seventh year in a row that the School District has received this honor in the "Extra Large Employer" (over 500 employees) category.

Winning the distinction of Best Places to Work for the District was determined by several factors including: a

low employee turnover rate and a 96% teacher retention rate, robust salary increases, a 99% fill rate on the first day of school for teaching and support positions, a streamlined "one-stop-shop" hiring experience that condenses the application process, interviewing, fingerprinting, and drug testing during one event.

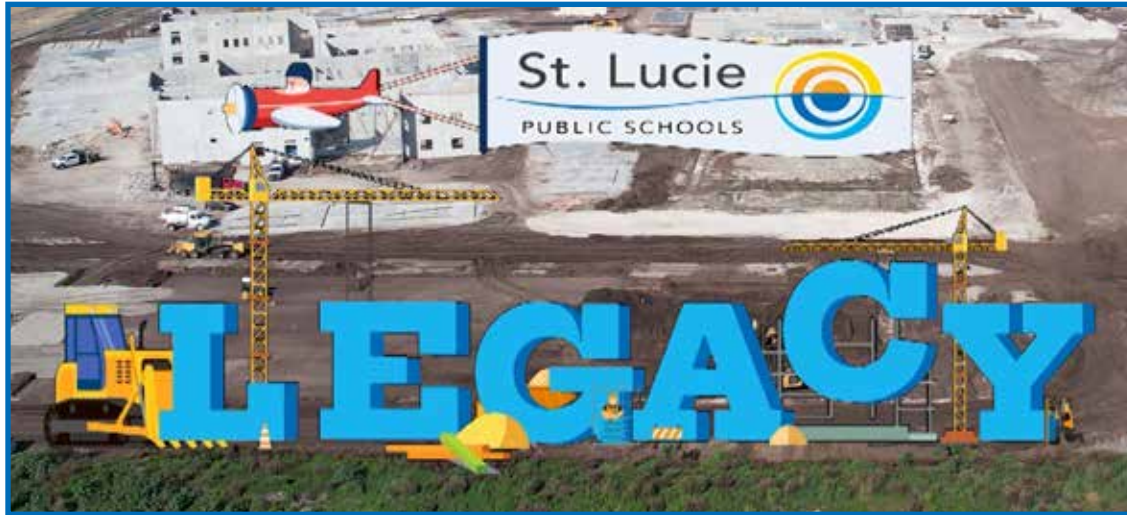
Substantial District-Wide Pay Increases



The School Board and the Superintendent fulfilled their commitment to make pay increases a financial priority. This resulted in all employee groups receiving not only a one-time bonus of \$1,000, but also receiving a pay increase between 5.5% and 7%. This was made possible

due to the positive and collaborative working relationship between the School District and employee bargaining units. It demonstrates how the Superintendent and School Board respects and values employees' commitment to making school the best part of a child's day.

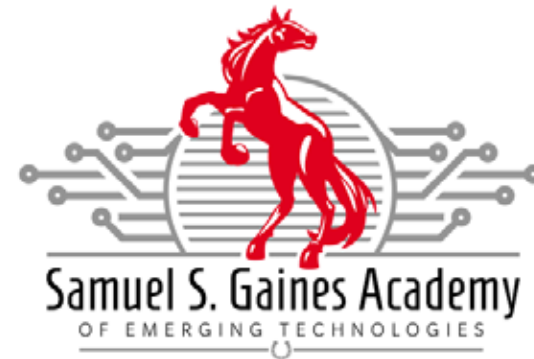

ECTAC Award For Samuel S. Gaines Academy

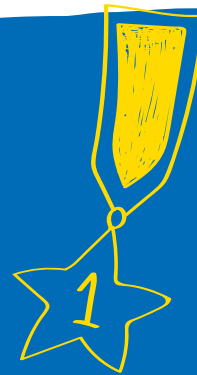


In 2012 ECTAC launched the Exceeding Expectations (E2) Project. An ECTAC data analysis team identifies high poverty schools that are exceeding expectations by showing significant progress in improving student achievement. For the 2023-24 Exceeding Expectations Project, 2022 school grade data was utilized to analyze 3,409 schools. Based on the criteria and the E2 steering committee, Samuel S. Gaines Academy was identified as one of 35 eligible exceeding expectations schools.

Criteria measures included:

- ELA and Math Achievement/Proficiency (FSA data)
- ELA and Math Learning Gains (as compared to 2019 FSA data)
- ELA and Math Achievement/Proficiency in ESSA Student Groups/Subgroups
- School Grade/School Grade History
- Percentage of Economically Disadvantaged Students

ST. LUCIE PUBLIC SCHOOLS' COMMITMENT TO ADVANCED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

St. Lucie Public Schools is dedicated to fostering an environment where every student has the opportunity to excel. The District believes that all students, regardless of their background or previous academic performance, have the potential to succeed in advanced learning programs. This commitment is not just a statement; it is an actionable plan that begins as early as elementary school and continues through high school.

In the early years, advanced learning is through the Accelerated Math Plan (AMP). Starting in third grade, students are introduced to an accelerated curriculum that includes both their current grade level standards and half of the subsequent year's curriculum. By fourth grade, students complete the second half of the fourth-grade curriculum and all of the fifth-grade curriculum. By fifth grade, students are already tackling sixth-grade math, setting them on a path

to access Algebra and Geometry—high school-level courses—while still in middle school.

The success of AMP is not anecdotal; it is backed by data. Students enrolled in AMP consistently show higher levels of proficiency compared to their peers who are not in the program. This holds true across various demographics and prior performance levels, indicating that the program effectively elevates students' mathematical understanding and skills.

As students transition to high school, the opportunities for advanced coursework expand even further. SLPS offers a range of college-level courses through prestigious programs such as the Cambridge Assessment International Education's AICE Program, the College Board's Advanced Placement Program (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and Dual Enrollment (DE) courses in partnership with Indian River State College.

The benefits of participating in these accelerated programs are multifaceted. Students receive weighted points towards their GPA, can earn college credits, gain a competitive advantage when applying to colleges, and become eligible for scholarships like Bright Futures. These advantages are significant, providing students with a head start in their post-secondary education and career aspirations.

SLPS's approach to advanced learning is inclusive. The District believes in providing these opportunities to all students, not just the traditionally high-achieving ones. Support systems are in place to help students who may doubt their abilities to succeed in these challenging courses. The message is clear: every student is capable, and the District is here to help them realize their potential.

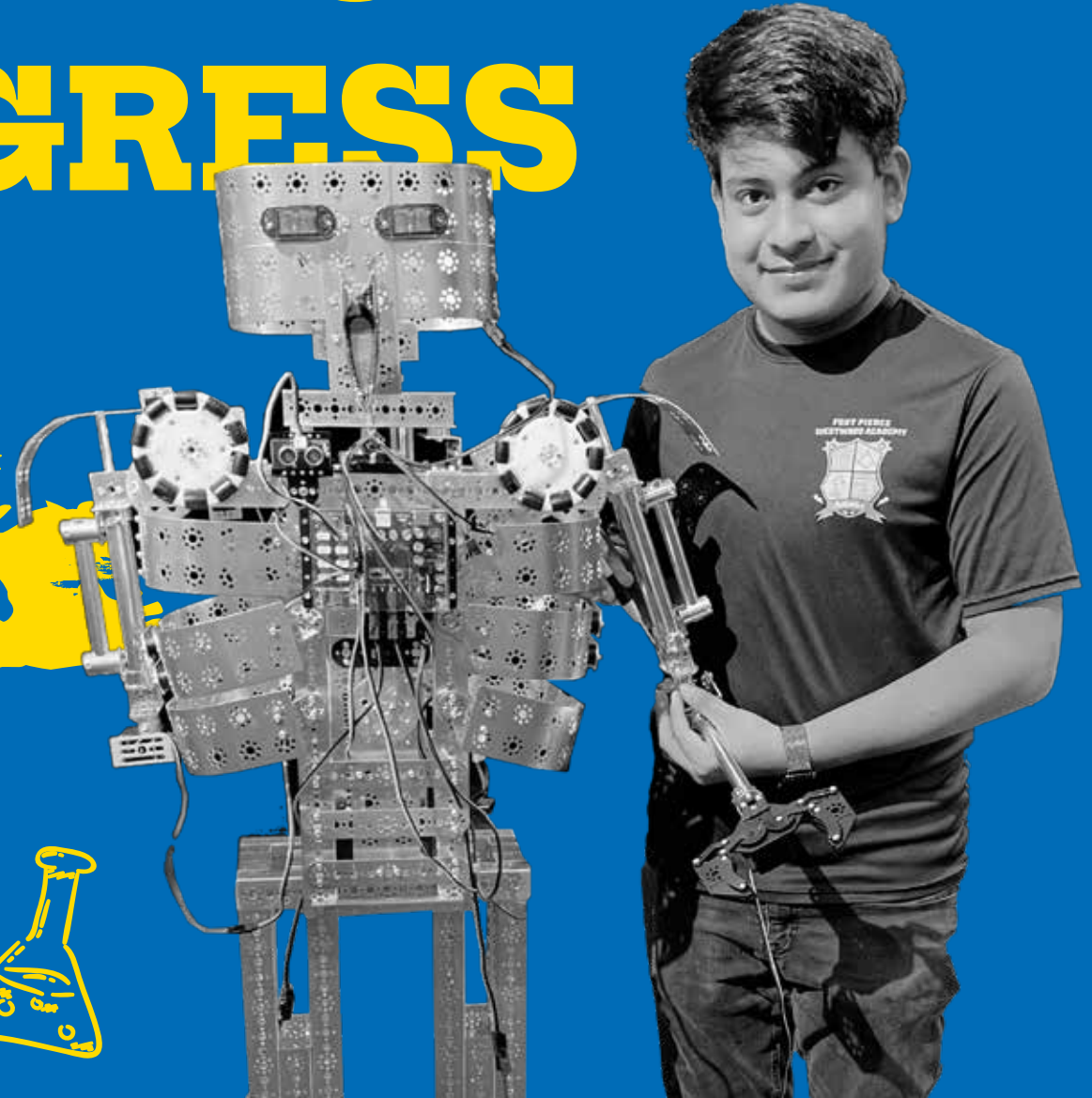
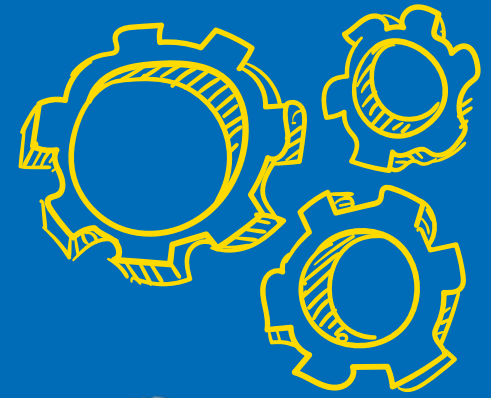

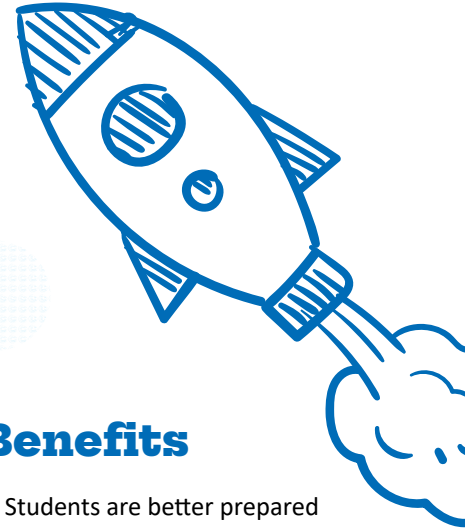
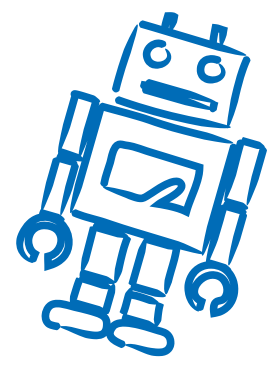
With the rising cost of college along with a competitive job market, SLPS students are meeting these challenges by graduating with college credit and workforce ready credentials.

Career and Technical Education (CTE) is an educational approach that equips students with the practical skills and knowledge needed to succeed in various career paths by earning industry certifications and college credits. It emphasizes hands-on learning experiences, combining academic instruction with vocational training and real-world application. CTE programs offer a wide range of disciplines, such as healthcare, engineering, information

technology, agriculture, and culinary arts, among others. Through these programs, students learn industry-specific skills which prepare them for industry certification exams.

The certifications earned by SLPS students prepares them for immediate entry into the workforce or further education in post-secondary institutions.

The SLPS CTE program serves more than 7,237 students a year.

Business Alliances

These events could not be made possible without collaboration between the School District and local businesses. The alliances that have been created have strengthened the community by providing students with employment and local businesses with skilled employees. Here, St. Lucie Public Schools Chief Communications Officer, interviewed Kevin Swain from Plus One Air to get his perspective on how SLPS CTE helps his business and the opportunities available to students.

Tell me a little bit about yourself and Plus One Air.

Kevin: Plus One Air, is a private aviation company based at the Ft. Pierce Airport. We provide charter services for our customers looking to fly privately on corporate aircraft. Whether it's business, leisure, travel--you name it, from A to B we provide that service, for a cost. So, we have been in business about five years now and I've been with the company going on four years.

What is your role in the company?

Kevin: My role with the company--I'm the Operations Manager. I'm in charge of all the logistics such as where the planes are going, how much fuel they're going to take, and whether all the FAA regulations that we have to maintain to fly safely are in place...obviously, we are a business so we want to operate efficiently. So that all comes into play.

What does an ideal candidate look like for you?

Kevin: An ideal candidate has to have a lot of organizational skills and good interpersonal skills, as well as some technical skills but that can easily be taught. We do have programs where interested young people can come and learn our business. We'll take somebody right out of school if it's the right person. As far as the mechanics side goes, there is an opportunity for an apprenticeship, where they can come in and be an apprentice under one of our master mechanics. Being a pilot...an applicant student would have to go to school first to get their license. It takes about 50 hours to get that and then they level up. They get their certified flight instructor, then they just keep leveling up and accrue hours. Once they get about one thousand hours of flight time, they can talk to us and fill out an application to be a pilot.

It sounds like Air Plus One really has a lot of job opportunities for interested applicants. What if there are students who aren't sure if this is the right career path for themselves?

Kevin: We encourage students to come and do the introductory flights, which are free. And they'll go up, they'll sit up front in a real single-engine plane, with an instructor and they'll fly around for about an hour. They may have the opportunity to take the controls and maybe land depending on how the student is doing and they'll get to log that hour in an actual FAA log book and take it with them. That's how you get into the business of what we're doing and it's not a hard path to do, just the right person has to be there because it's not for everybody because we are a 24/7 company; 365. Aviation has no holidays, but, I love it. I love doing it and it's a great time. It's fun. Every day is always a new challenge.

It sounds like you have opportunities for training, apprenticeships so they may not be able to just walk into that position, but you do have opportunities for them to learn the position.

Kevin: Absolutely. And, again, I encourage any student to go do an introductory flight. See if aviation catches you. And come see the operations because a lot of people don't know how...before I got into this, I didn't know how airplanes did all things they do and the whole behind-the-scenes stuff that makes a flight successful. Because there is a lot of moving parts that a lot of people don't see, and so that's what is very fascinating and what I love about it.

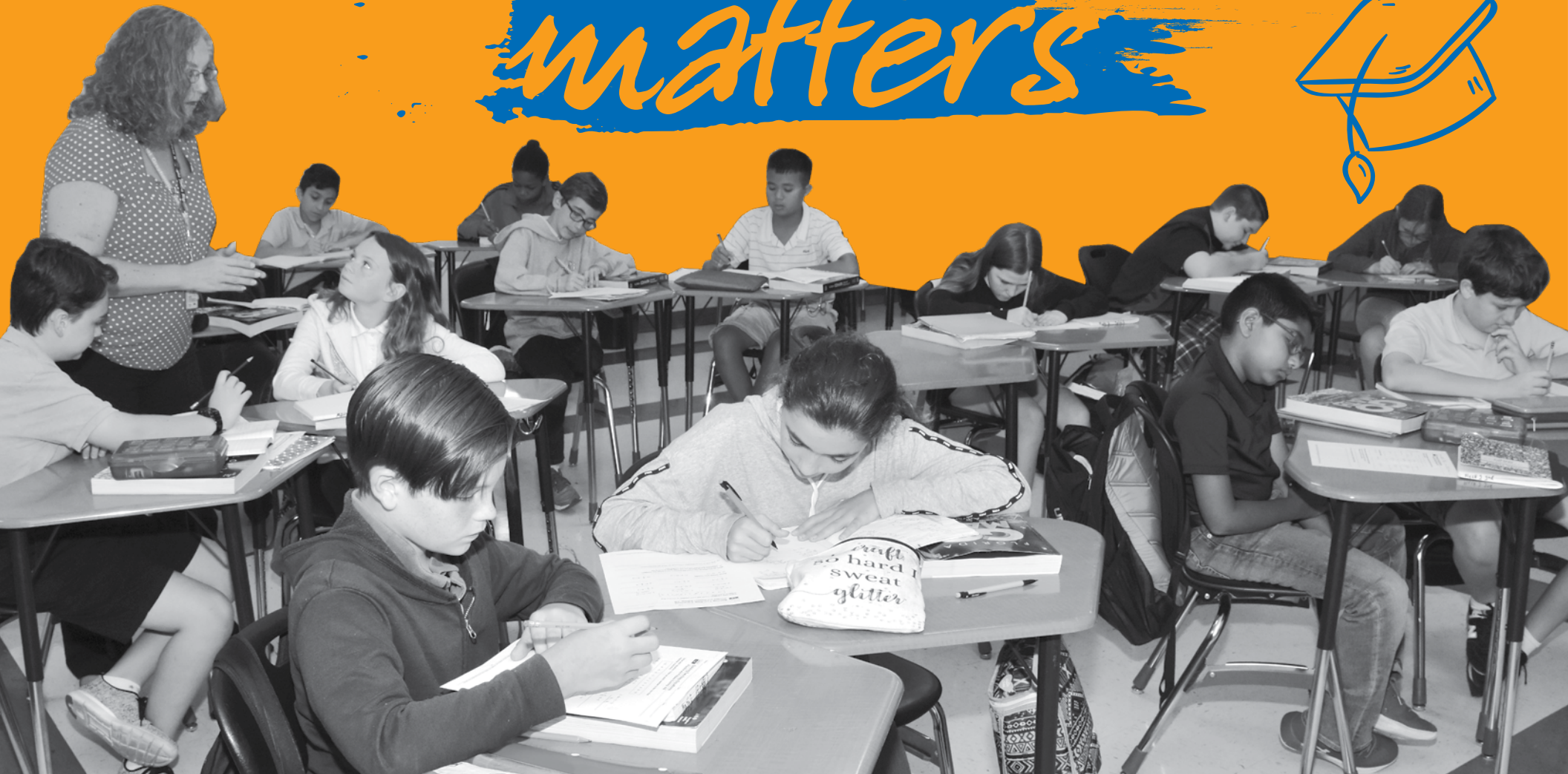

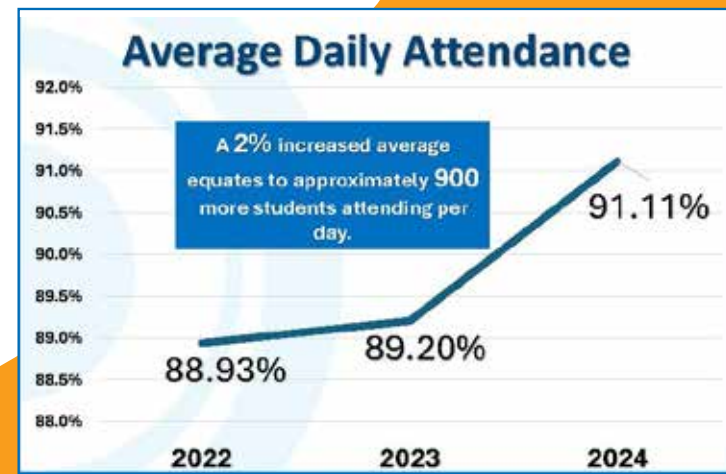



With a population of over 300,000, St. Lucie County is one of the fastest growing counties in the state of Florida. St. Lucie Public Schools has risen to meet this challenge of an ever-growing community through several building and upgrading initiatives which include the construction of a brand-new high school and K-8 school in addition to a new building for Fort Pierce Westwood Academy. Along with new construction, SLPS continues to enhance and refurbish existing school buildings as well as maintain school facilities.

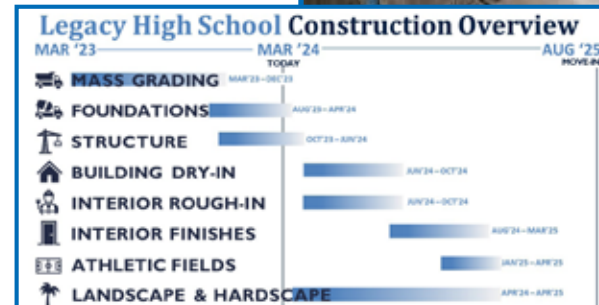

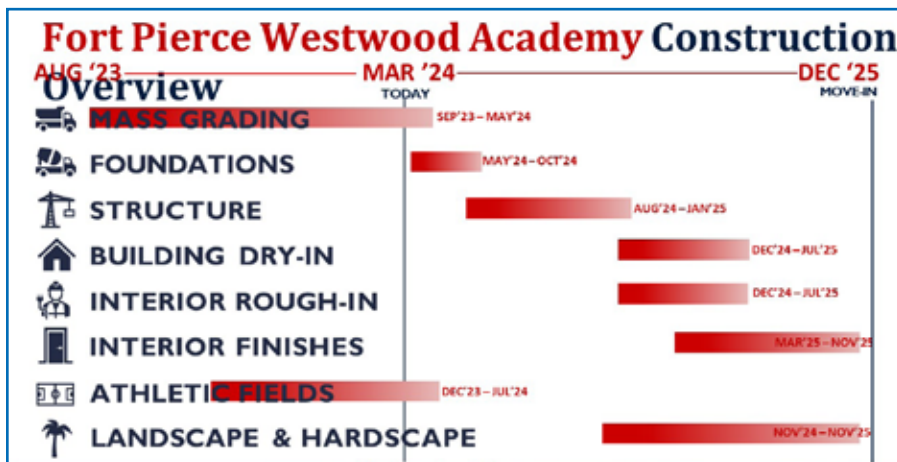

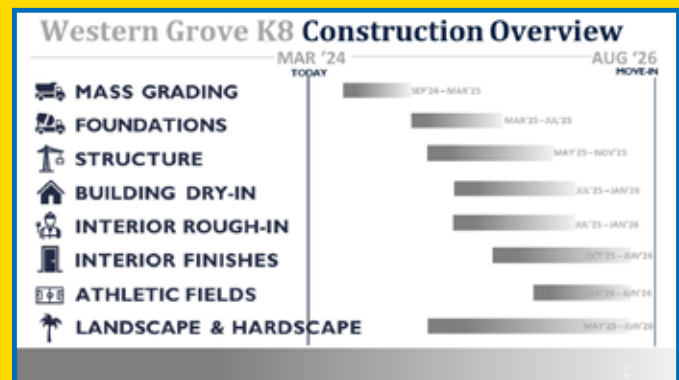

There will be an auditorium seating capacity of 1,274 and a seating capacity of 595 in the state-of-the-art cafeterium.
